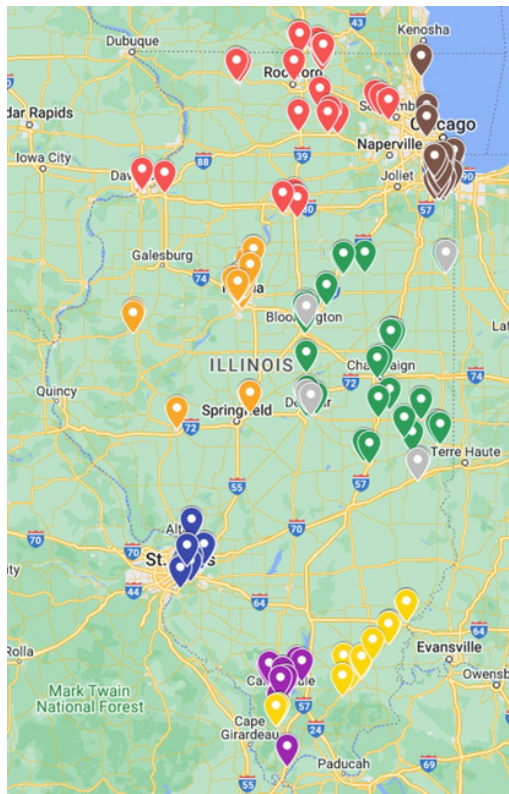


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High Impact Tutoring Key Components

- Funding at or below 75% adequacy
- At least 40% low income
- Disproportionate COVID impact
- High percentage of remote versus in-person days
